



Scrip Information



What is Scrip?

Scrip is a term that means, “substitute money”. In this case the “substitute money” is gift cards or certificates.

Scrip is a fundraiser that benefits both the school and you! Scrip is a popular fundraiser because families don't have to sell anything. You are able to generate revenue by making regular household purchases that you would make anyway. Groceries, clothing, toys, gifts, and gasoline can all be purchased with Scrip. Scrip cards also make great gifts!

How does Scrip work?

The Scrip office purchases gift cards/certificates at a discounted price (usually 2-10%) less than face value. Families then purchase these cards/certificates at the full face value. The difference is the profit.

Once you generate a credit (or profit) of \$50, you start earning credit that can be applied toward your registration fee. Upon reaching \$50, half of what you earn goes toward your registration and half goes to the school. Credit is accumulated January – December and does not carry over.

How great is that! Use Scrip when you spend, and both you and the school benefit.

How do I get started?

Simply complete an Enrollment form and return it with your first Scrip order. Enrollment forms, Order forms, and Scrip policies can be picked up in the Scrip Office (located in the church rectory) or downloaded from the school website (btschool.org)
